Krista Anderson Directors Board Report

The 2021-2022 Audit will be conducted on August $24^{th} - 28^{th}$ This will be after our board meeting. The use of Quick Books has made this process somewhat easier for the Auditors. We have learned to keep the records in place until the Audit is completed. That makes it easier for us, we are not digging out of boxes for any answers that we need to get for the Auditors.

The outdoor pool is closed for the season. We started with 15 guards and are ending with 6 available guards to finish the season. Expanded recruitment will need to occur for the next season. We tried some new ideas to make the pool more attractive to Ulysses Patrons, we had available cornhole game, sidewalk chalk, sprinklers on the sidewalks, and more interaction with Guards. We hope we have had some success. Pool management shortened hours to help with retention of the remaining 6 to 8 guards, tried to rotate in different ways and letting off one guard at a time for a day even when we were short. Working 7 days a week without a break is very wearing. Plans are in the works to correct this problem.

All Staff are doing a great job to get ready for Fall. Tri-Fecta, Football, Volleyball, Cheer, Backto-School project, putting the big pool to rest, Fall hours at the Pool and a New Season in Gymnastics. All will start after the school year begins. It is always nice to transition to a new season.

Our next meeting will be September 8th, at the GCRC Office. This will be our Neutral Rate Hearing and the GCRC Budget Meeting. I would also like it be our regular meeting for September. Mark your calendars for this date at 4:30pm at the office.
